"Is it my fault," muses Roquentin, "in all he tells me, I recognize the lack of the genuine article? Is it my fault if, as he speaks, I see all the humanists I have known rise up? I have known so many of them!" And then he lists the radical humanist, the so called "left" humanist, and Communist Humanist, the Catholic humanist, all claiming a passion for their fellow men. Quite naturally, the skeptical Roquentin ends by saying how "they all hate each other: as individuals, not as men." Fully aware of the misuse and false comfort in the use of the term, Professor Aloni proceeds to restore meaning to the word as well as appropriate its educational significance. There is a freshness in this book, a restoration of a lost clarity, a regaining of authentic commitment.
